Dr. Gautam Chandra is a Senior Consultant in the Department of General Surgery at Manipal Hospitals, Ranchi, with a career marked by academic excellence, clinical expertise, and a commitment to advancing surgical practices. Graduating with an MBBS in 2003, Dr. Chandra further specialised with an MS in General Surgery in 2010 and earned a Fellowship in Minimal Access Surgery (FMAS), reflecting his dedication to mastering surgical techniques. His academic contributions include significant papers on diverse topics such as burns during pregnancy, the role of glutamine-supplemented total parenteral nutrition in severe acute pancreatitis, and clinicopathological studies of soft tissue sarcomas. His repertoire of publications also features rare case reports, including those on giant juvenile fibroadenomas, isolated hydatid cysts of the breast, and diaphragmatic neurofibromas, underscoring his ability to address complex and atypical medical scenarios. He is the best General Surgeon in Ranchi. Dr. Chandra's clinical acumen extends to a wide array of specialised surgeries, ranging from ileal sarcomas and diaphragmatic repairs to choledocho-duodenostomies, right hemicolectomy, splenectomies, and intricate procedures such as malignant teratoma management with dysgerminoma. His professional journey includes pivotal roles such as Specialised Medical Officer from 2011 to 2012, and he has been serving in this capacity since 2015 with unwavering dedication. A notable moment in his career was his presentation at IAP NEOCON 2016 on tracheo-oesophageal fistulas, reflecting his active engagement in scholarly dialogues.
